- In partnership with the NM BIPOC Coalition, we are committed to holding systems accountable to the communities they serve by promoting leadership and funding structures that reflect the people most affected.
- We are in ongoing discussions with the New Mexico Medicaid program to design a doula (birth worker / reproductive healthcare worker) services program that reflects the needs and desires of New Mexico doulas and Medicaid members.
- We are members of the advisory committee for the Reproductive Healthcare Success Project, advocating for and co-creating the first full-spectrum reproductive healthcare facility in Las Cruces, New Mexico.

Doulas are a vital part of the communities in which they serve and the healthcare systems in which they work.

We advocate and work to reclaim our rightful place at the side of our relatives as they navigate these systems. All people deserve to feel cared for, supported, informed, and empowered in their reproductive healthcare access and experiences.
